Community volunteers started the Foundation in 1986 to address a need for quality before-and after-school care for working families. Out of that need grew the popular Kids Club program in every elementary school. Volunteers then expanded the Foundation as the district's trusted partner to help generous donors support Papillion La Vista students through fin ancial gifts.

Today, the PLCS Foundation is a well-established, 501(c)(3) charitable organization that is governed by a volunteer board of directors and managed by a professional staff. We are the only non-profit organization that exists to exclusively help PLCS students – all 12,000 of them – no matter their interests or the schools they attend.

We help Papillion La Vista kids. Period.

#### How We Make a Difference

Hand in hand with donors, we enhance educational opportunities for PLCS students that would not otherwise be possible. We are the school district's trusted philanthropic partner, and we help working families by offering affordable childcare. We invest in schools through helpful grants and initiatives that benefit all students.

We provide supplemental funding for district priorities. You may already know about the support for Teacher Grants, Outdoor Education, Student Tours, Scholarships and AP exam fees. But that is just scratching the surface of how donors engage with the Foundation to change the lives of our kids.

## Our District SUPPORT PROGRAMS

PLCS students are eager to learn. Obstacles make it more challenging for some kids. With 28% of students qualifying for free or reduced lunch, nearly one-third of PLCS families have difficulty paying bills and buying healthy meals. Students with financial needs attend every one of our district's schools. Through these featured programs, generous donors help lessen the obstacles that students face.

#### **PLCS Community Closet**

The PLCS Community Closet launched in 2021 with startup grant funding from the Foundation. It provides free clothing and personal hygiene items for students and families in need. Inventory is maintained thanks to financial gifts, and donations of new and gently used clothing items.

The needs, along with district enrollment, are growing. Inventory continually flows out of the Community Closet, meaning restocking the shelves for the next shoppers never ends.

#### **Student Emergency Fund**

When setbacks occur for students, they need help to stay in school, and they need it fast.

The Student Emergency Fund supports basic needs, such as health, shelter, and transportation in times of crisis. When emergency needs are identified, PLCS social workers quickly step in to assist respectfully and confidentially. They learn about the emergency with the goal of keeping the student in school and able to study while at home. While many needs are addressed by a network of supportive Sarpy County agencies, some challenges require immediate attention. In those cases, the generosity of a caring community is extended through the Student Emergency Fund.

## SKILLED AND TECHNICAL SCIENCES FUND CELEBRATED WITH RIBBON CUTTING

Industry leaders know that skilled and technical trades jobs, many that are high paying, are among the most difficult to staff. There is a significant need for welders, electricians, plumbers and machinists. At the same time, many high school students look for career paths that do not require a four-year college education. They would prefer to enter the workforce following graduation from high school.

Local citizens asked Papillion La Vista Community Schools to help address these challenges. PLCS responded by launching a new, innovative skilled and technical

trades curriculum that allows students to gain valuable experience in this field. Hands-on learning occurs in new, state of the art facilities at both PLCS high schools. The new and improved programs officially opened at a ribbon cutting in April 2022. The event showcased the new spaces and recognized generous donors.

The Foundation's Kids Club program meets the unique childcare needs of Kindergarten through 6th grade children by offering a safe, reliable, and fun childcare program at each PLCS elementary school. It is open at all 16 elementary schools during the school year, before and after school, and on select out-of-school days. Kids Club also offers a full summer program at consolidated elementary schools. Enrollment in the program continued to rebound after pandemic-related declines in 2020.
